Drawn by a love of the desert and days filled with sunshine, Sylvia and Don Owens became members of Desert Mountain in the early '90s. Tennis players, they eventually developed a love of golf. The Sonoran Club/Fitness Center which caters to all age groups of the community through state of the art equipment, trainers and classes was a

place they went constantly.

In 1997, Sylvia was diagnosed with breast cancer. Don, a member of the DM board from 1996 to 2001, told a few people, who told a few others. "Even though the community was much smaller then," Sylvia said, "Bam! People started a food brigade and made arrangements to take me to chemo and radiation. The outpouring of support was incredible. And it still is."

"This is something unique, I think, to Desert Mountain," Sylvia said. "People join this community and become very, very close here. And as a club, this sense of community has flourished from the very start."

The outpouring of support Sylvia received during her battle with breast cancer left her and good friend Mary Henderson, determined to make a positive impact on breast cancer. Mary suggested they have a golf tournament to try and raise money. "Neither of us had done anything like this before," Sylvia admitted. "So we met with Dick and Jeri Hyland for help. Dick said, "I'll take care of the golf and the lunch. You get the people to play."

Jeri arranged for the tournament prizes to be donated and Mary and Sylvia called everyone they knew. After 104 people signed up, Dick had to say, "Stop. We can't have any more."

Tricia O'Keefe designed the original C.A.R.E. logo and had shirts made. Pat Cox suggested, and then ended up running the silent auction. The tennis ladies volunteered to do the registration and decorate the tables. There was no

Welcome all to the 2016-2017 Desert Mountain Club season, our seventh since the turnover. The staff is excited to introduce to you new programs and activities to enhance your Desert Mountain Club lifestyle and to

provide you and your guests with an unparalleled level of customer service.

In approximately six weeks, Desert Mountain will be in the international spotlight once more during the 2016 Charles Schwab Cup Championship November 7-13. It will be our fourth year of hosting this high visibility event that puts Desert Mountain in the global spotlight.

As you know, according to our contract with the PGA TOUR Champions, the Schwab Cup moves to Phoenix Country Club next year. We have had some early talks with the TOUR Champions about potentially hosting future tournaments—whether it's the return of the Schwab Cup or a regular season tournament on a semi-regular basis. While this is part of the Club's strategic plan to keep Desert Mountain in the spotlight, to build our reputation and to attract new members, it would have to be a great event for the members as well.

The Cochise course overseeding has been completed and is in excellent condition and once again, the players are happy to be back at Desert Mountain. At the Charles Schwab Cup Media Day on August 30 to kick off the event, 2015 tournament winner Billy Andrade told local media, Scottsdale Mayor Jim Lane and Charles Schwab representative Dave Tibbetts, "When you go in the [Desert Mountain] gates, you know you had a great year to be here." Mayor Lane pointed out that having the tournament at Desert Mountain for the past four years has added substantially to the positive economic impact golf brings to Scottsdale. Also in attendance was Billy's good friend, retired MLB pitcher Roger Clemens who played Cochise that morning.

To date, 1,588 members have reserved their complimentary badges for the event and have purchased nearly \$10,000 in daily, weekly and Legends Lounge tickets for their guests. Tickets, which are selling well to the public through schwabcup.com, go on sale on Ticketmaster starting October 3. This year there are more than 500 tournament volunteers, many of whom are Desert Mountain Club members. We thank you for being generous with your time and for your continued support of the tournament and the Club.

Sonoran Clubhouse "Coming Alive"

We're just weeks away from completion of Phase 2 of the Sonoran Fitness, Tennis and Spa. Floor and wall finishes have been installed and the rooms are nearly ready for furniture installation. There are some

very exciting and cutting-edge features in the class-rooms, functional training room and spa:

- Sport court flooring in the fitness and Pilates classrooms have a 7 millimeter-thick layer of composite material topped with anti-microbial vinyl for superior shock absorption that puts less stress on knees, ankles and joints.
- Auto lighting that turns room lights off when the last person leaves a room, another way to practice sustainability.
- Art glass accents made from glass rescued from an old building in Bullhead City and recycled by Phoenix artisan Khalsa Sevak.
- Mirrors that are backlit to make shaving and makeup application very easy.
- Portuguese, textured porcelain walls leading to the spa entrance are backlit and shadowed for a contemporary feel and to give the appearance of movement.

On behalf of the board of directors, I thank you for your continued patience, humor and enthusiasm during this final stretch. You will receive an invitation soon to the October 26 grand opening and I hope you'll come by to celebrate and utilize this amazing facility.

Summer Projects

Director of Agronomy Shawn Emerson and his team were busy over the summer making improvements to the courses to enhance your golf experience. They:

- Leveled Apache's east range to create six additional stations and added more surface to allow two more weeks of divots before replacing the sod.
- Changed several holes on Geronimo:
 - The cart path behind the 17th green was leveled to make modifications to the traps and surrounding areas
 - An area in front of the green on the 12th hole was opened by removing the mound along with changes to the bunkers
 - The hill on the 14th hole was lowered to view the green, along with changes to the bunkers
 - The green on the 15th hole was redone to include changes to the bunkers and to soften the swale behind the green

In addition, Director of Facilities and Construction Todd Bruen and his team have completed or are nearing completion on an extensive list of operational and capital projects that include, among others, new upholstery on all leather booths in the Apache dining room; and the replacement of the air-conditioning cooling tower at Apache. At Cochise/Geronimo, the team completed an LED retrofit to the step lighting, mixed grill, and men's and ladies' locker rooms; and installed plank tile flooring in the ladies library. New umbrellas and heat lamps for the Chiricahua Grill have been installed; and Outlaw received upgraded security cameras from analog to digital IP cameras. At Renegade, new evaporative coolers for course restrooms are in progress and a leaky roof at the Jim Flick Golf Performance Center has been repaired.

I'd like to thank Shawn and Todd and their teams for working so hard to maintain and improve Desert Mountain's facilities to the highest standards.

INGREDIENTS:

1 cup Milk 6 pcs. Texas Toast

3 ea. Eggs 6 oz. Laura's Sinful Cinnamon Granola

1 T Agave Nectar 1 pint Fresh Berry Mix
1/4 t Vanilla Paste dash Powdered Sugar
2 oz. Grand Marnier Micro Mint





Arizona in the fall means winter overseeding is underway on the golf courses at Desert Mountain. Cochise, Apache, Renegade and Chiricahua are overseeded "wall-to-wall" and Outlaw is a partial overseed with dormant bermudagrass rough. Geronimo is the course that is out of the overseed rotation this year. The agronomic plan for Geronimo this winter will be to control Poa annua and clumpy ryegrass when the bermudagrass is dormant. This plan has been very effective on our other courses in years past and there have been significant reductions in the Poa populations.

Several projects were completed on The Mountain this summer by the Nicklaus design team and Desert Mountain management. These design changes and construction projects were completed to make the courses more playable and to make them safer for you and your guests.

GERONIMO 12

- Lowered the elevation of the bunker complex on the right and relocated a bunker to open the view into the green.
- Devegetated on the right side to open the view to the bunkers from the tees.

GERONIMO 14

- Expanded the gold/blue tee to double its original size.
- Eliminated fairway bunker on the right and added bunker further to the right.
- Lowered the landing area and shortened the carry from the tee by 10 yards.

GERONIMO 15

- Eliminated 3 bunkers right of the green and relocated the small pot bunker in front of the green to the left.
- Added a desert feature to the right of the green.
- Added a new bunker 100 yards from the green.

GERONIMO 17

- Re-routed the cart path and eliminated the stairs down to the green.
- Removed the bunker behind the green to allow access to the green.

CHIRICAHUA 11 & 12

• Reduced the steepness of the slope in the cart path between the 11 green and 12 tee.

OUTLAW 3

• Built a new white tee.

OUTLAW 14

• Built a new green tee.

APACHE PRACTICE RANGE

- Leveled and resodded the tee.
- Restored the bunkers on the range floor to their original shape.

HOA SAFETY TIP

Safety, whether it be your personal safety or that of your property, is one of your HOA's highest priorities and a core deliverable to Desert Mountain residents and their visitors. In the past year, we have seen these alarming road safety trends:

- Vehicles traveling at 15 mph over the speed limit are up 57% northbound on the Desert Mountain Parkway, and 20% southbound. The highest speed was 72 mph.
- Vehicles traveling at 10 mph over the speed limit were up 7%.
- Flagrant stop sign violations at the intersection of Desert Mountain Parkway and Desert Hills Drive.

The HOA Master Association Board is taking action to keep our roads safe.

- Patrol speed enforcement increased 25% daily beginning in the second quarter.
- Patrol stop sign enforcement doubled beginning in July.
- Beginning October 1, 2016 new fines and penalties go into effect contact the HOA for information on these charges or visit the website.
- eGo tag suspension added to second and severe violations.
- Fines increased in all categories.

These new, more stringent measures apply to everyone – vendors, employees and visitors as well as residents. All parties are being advised of how seriously we take our road safety, evidenced by the new fine structure and enforcement activity. These new penalties are consistent with those assessed at other communities in the area. Our objective is not to collect fines but to address chronic speeding that endangers us all. We are all responsible for creating a safe community. Please drive responsibly and call the main gate at (480) 635-5630 if you see excessive speeding or unsafe driving. Ensure that your visitors and friends know that our community values safety on our roads – it's up to us all to make this happen.





The Jim Flick Golf Performance Center will offer more clinics this season than ever before. Back by popular demand are the Green Reading, Short Game, Bunker, Wedge Works, Beginner Golf Workshop and Play Like a Pro clinics.

We will be kicking off the season with a new two part series on the Rules of Golf. Part 1 is designed to ensure students leave with a comfortable understanding of how to read and use the Rules of Golf book included with registration. We will then discuss and have on-course demonstrations on what to do for out of bounds, lost ball, unplayable lie and hazard situations. Part 2 is designed for people who attended Part 1 or already have a good understanding of the basic rules of golf. Students will learn how to handle a rules question in a tournament situation, how to use the rules of golf to your advantage and we will discuss more in-depth some of the finer nuances of the Rules of Golf.





At the time, cancer—especially breast cancer—wasn't a subject that was really discussed. But Dr. Pockaj talked about the importance of early detection as well as the impact of diet, fitness as well as current innovations on cancer. She really blew everyone away.

"During the process of putting on the CARE tournament, Mary and I never considered that this would become more than a one-time event. But by the end of the luncheon, everyone was asking us if we were going to do it next year. The answer to that was yes. At the end of the first CARE event, we had raised \$25,000. We were shocked and thrilled. And so was the Mayo Clinic, when Dr. Pockaj walked in with a paper bag full of checks and said, "This is for you."

CARE is a Desert Mountain member-driven charity. Today it has raised \$6,000,000 originally for cancer research and now directed at individualized medicine at both the Mayo Clinic and HonorHealth.

"Twenty years ago, I could never have envisioned that CARE would continue on," Sylvia said. "For a 'closed event' (club members only), to go beyond seven years is remarkable. And I think that is a credit to Desert Mountain members. Over the years, different people step up and get involved and infuse CARE with new energy and ideas."

The members of Desert Mountain are a special group of giving people. This is woven through the fabric of the community. "As the member population has expanded, so did our outreach to surrounding areas. You will find our members in the Creative Women of Pinnacle Peak, Foothills Caring Corp., Youth Angels, Desert Foothills Land Trust, Desert Foothills Library, MIM and many other important causes."

"My husband, Don, dreamed of one day restoring the Timberline Amphitheater on Mt. Hood," Sylvia said. "Sadly, he passed away before this could happen." Sylvia asked that in lieu of flowers, people donate to Friends of Timberline. The remembrances given to the Forest Service for Don restored the Amphitheater.

When the Forest Service ranger of Timberline transferred to Arizona, she called Sylvia after the North Scottsdale fire of 2012. The Forest Service had the money to take care of the burned land, but had no funds for plants to help bring the desert back faster. Sylvia called pal Paulette Maslick who suggested we throw a Sponsor A Saguaro event. And members responded, raising \$25,000. It took the Forest Service five years to spend it. "If you travel on Cave Creek toward Bartlett Lake, you will see a sign on the right that says "Thank You Desert Mountain Members" surrounded by little cacti."

Sylvia Owens nee Takeuchi was born and raised in Oregon, spent some of her early childhood with her family in the Japanese internment camp in Portland. She attended Willamette University in Salem, OR and then went to work for Mark Hatfield, the governor of Oregon. She eventually left to work for Nelson Rockefeller's campaign for president in New York City, then as a fundraiser for Lincoln Center under John Rockefeller III, before returning to work for Hatfield when he became a US Senator in Washington DC.

Eventually Sylvia landed a job in human resources working for the investment bank of Donaldson, Lufkin and Jenrette. A few years later she met Don, fell in love, got married and worked with him in their distribution business.

Even after her battle with cancer, it was after Don died, when she needed Desert Mountain the most. Sylvia said, "It's all too easy to not get out of your PJ's and drift into isolation. I decided I had to get out once a day. To make sure I got fixed up if nothing else. To overcome the grief and the loneliness and to adjust to life without Don. So I called the club and signed up. Monday – Bridge, Tuesday – Golf, Wednesday – Bridge, Thursday — Golf, Friday — Bridge. And it helped. Tremendously."

Desert Mountain has something for everyone, virtually every day. "I find this beautiful community an ideal place to live as a single woman. And so do many others. The security and safety are equally as important as the vast array of amenities."

Sylvia is always busy. "There is always something going on—dinner, movie, trips, concerts, shopping, happy hour, hobby clubs — you name it. There are so many single women here that when someone has an idea you just run with it. That's one of the wonderful things about living here—people are ready to do things. To make something happen. And the club is always there to facilitate if we need help."

Sylvia's enthusiasm is boundless. Her newest project? Starting a support resource for people newly diagnosed with cancer.






